Purpose

The National Diploma in Journalism (Graduate) (Level 7) [Ref: 0528] replaces the level 6 National Diploma in Journalism [Ref: 0004] and will enable journalists to develop professionally in the skill areas which best fit their personal needs and career choices. It recognises both the acquisition of specialist skills and a broadening of journalists' education bases. The introduction of elective possibilities outside the journalism domain is to allow journalists to deepen their knowledge of certain specialities.

It is expected that most students will study for the diploma while working as journalists. Combinations of unit standards or single unit standards may be offered by accredited polytechnics, private training establishments, universities or businesses either on-site or by distance learning. Those studying for part of the qualification will need to ensure they can access the required number of unit standards in order to obtain the credits to complete the total required for the diploma.

It is envisaged that eventually some unit standards will be assessed in the work place. The radio and television unit standards will be assessed either in a non-broadcast studio with the appropriate equipment or in radio or television broadcast studios while on the job.

Previous versions of the qualification

Version 1 of this qualification replaced the level 6 National Diploma in Journalism [Ref: 0004].

It contains the following changes to structure and content in comparison to the National Diploma in Journalism [Ref: 0004]: this diploma is level 7; standard 1485 is a compulsory standard; standards 1484-1489, and 1491-1494 have been reviewed, their level has risen from 6 to 7, and their credit values have changed; standard 1490 has been replaced by standard 14228. The qualification now includes two elective sections; the first relates to journalism and includes nine new level 7 standards; and the second allows the balance of credits to come from anywhere on the National Qualifications Framework.

This qualification contains standards that replace earlier standards. For the purposes of this qualification, people who have gained credit for the expiring standards are exempt from the requirement to gain credit for the replacement standards – see table below.
