The requirements of this standard are consistent with the NZCEL Guiding Document. - 4 All assessment activities must be conducted in English, which must not be the candidate's first language.
- 5 The assessor must be satisfied that the candidate can independently demonstrate competence against the unit standard.

  - i the outcomes are assessed as part of an integrated unit of work, relevant to the learning context of the candidate;
  - ii assessment be conducted in conjunction with assessment against other English Language unit standards at this level.
- 7 Candidate's responses may be oral, written or visual, as relevant and appropriate. Responses may contain textual or linguistic errors and inaccuracies, but these must not obscure meaning. This standard assesses reading skills, not spoken or written skills.
- 8 For this unit standard, texts:
  - i must be chosen independently by the candidate;
  - ii must be guided by the first 2500 words of New General Service List;
  - lii must have a connecting focus or purpose.

- 1.2 Connections across the texts are made in relation to a specific purpose.
  - Range connections may include but are not limited to comparison, evaluation.
