Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Prepare equipment and establish cell builder beehives to accept grafted larvae.

Performance criteria

1.1 Prepare suitable equipment for establishing cell builder beehives.

1.2 Select suitable cell builder beehives for accepting grafted larvae.

Range population of bees, honey and pollen stores, number of brood frames, larvae health, disease status.

- 1.3 Manipulate cell builder beehive to receive grafted larvae.
- 1.4 Introduce cell bars with queen cell cups.

Outcome 2

Graft larvae.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Prepare equipment for grafting larvae.
- 2.2 Graft larvae into queen cell cups using frame selected from breeder beehive with suitable size larvae.
- 2.3 Introduce cell bar with grafted larvae into cell builder hive and feed beehive as required.
- 2.4 Assess the success rate of the grafting exercise, and monitor feed as required.
- 2.5 Carry out post grafting manipulations to the cell builder hive.

Outcome 3

Remove queen bee cells and mated caged queen bees and distribute for domestic supply.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Remove gueen bee cells from cell builder beehives and place in incubator.
- 3.2 Introduce gueen bee cells into gueenless beehives or nucleus beehives.
- 3.3 Prepare queen bee cages for the introduction of mated queens.
- 3.4 Introduce mated queen bee and attendant worker bees into queen cage at the optimum time.
- 3.5 Maintain queen bee records of all operations.
- 3.6 Package and distribute queen bees for domestic supply.
